Hebrews 10:11-12 KJV And every priest standeth daily ministering and
offering oftentimes the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins: (12)
But this man, after he had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever, sat down on
the right hand of God;

I John 1:7 KJV ...and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all
sin.

I John 5:13 KJV These things have I written unto you that believe on the
name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life...

Galatians 2:20-21 KJV I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not
I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the
faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me. (21) I do not
frustrate the grace of God: for if righteousness come by the law, then Christ is
dead in vain.

Romans 6:6-7 KJV Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with him, that
the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin.
(7) For he that is dead is freed from sin.

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The Blood of the Lamb



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You may have heard of Jesus Christ and his death, burial, and resurrection: but what is the importance of his shed blood? Since blood sacrifice is not prominent in our culture today the thought of such a thing may be foreign to most. This tract should help give you more understanding on the importance of biblical blood sacrifice and where it started.

THE OLD TESTAMENT LAW

The blood of bulls and goats were used as atonement in the Old Testament.

Leviticus 4:27-30, 35 KJV *And if any one of the common people sin through ignorance, while he doeth somewhat against any of the commandments of the LORD concerning things which ought not to be done, and be guilty; (28) Or if his sin, which he hath sinned, come to his knowledge: then he shall bring his offering, a kid of the goats, a female without blemish, for his sin which he hath sinned. (29) And he shall lay his hand upon the head of the sin offering, and slay the sin offering in the place of the burnt offering. (30) And the priest shall take of the blood thereof with his finger, and put it upon the horns of the altar of burnt offering, and shall pour out all the blood thereof at the bottom of the altar....(35e) and the priest shall make an atonement for his sin that he hath committed, and it shall be forgiven him.*

THE BLOOD IS GIVEN BY GOD TO MAKE AN ATONEMENT FOR SOULS

Leviticus 17:11 KJV *For the life of the flesh is in the blood: and I have given it to you upon the altar to make an atonement for your souls: for it is the blood that maketh an atonement for the soul.*

The blood atonement in the Old Testament was a like figure of the Lord Jesus Christ's blood atonement. Way back in Genesis 22 there is promise of God providing himself a lamb for the atonement of our sins.

Genesis 22:8 KJV *And Abraham said, My son, God will provide himself a lamb for a burnt offering; so they went both of them together.*

John 1:29 KJV *The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.*

This is why Jesus' blood is so precious to us sinners

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THE NEW TESTAMENT

After the death of Jesus on the cross there was no need for the blood atonement of bulls and goats. Christ's sacrifice was once and for all. He ended the Old Testament and a new one began.

Hebrews 9:12-16 KJV *Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by his own blood he entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us. (13) For if the blood of bulls and of goats, and the ashes of an heifer sprinkling the unclean, sanctifieth to the purifying of the flesh: (14) How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God? (15) And for this cause he is the mediator of the new testament.... (16) For where a testament is, there must also of necessity be the death of the testator.*

Romans 10:4 KJV *For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth.*

Romans 3:28, 30 KJV *Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith without the deeds of the law.... (30) Seeing it is one God, which shall justify the circumcision by faith, and uncircumcision through faith.*

WITHOUT BLEMISH/WITHOUT SPOT

As you had read in Leviticus 4:28 and Hebrews 9:14 there is mention of without spot and without blemish. The law included bringing a sacrificial lamb that was not maimed or having physical imperfections because it was an offering to God for sin. It was a type of the Lord Jesus Christ who is perfect and without sin.

Romans 8:3-4 KJV *For what the law could not do, in that it was weak through the flesh, God sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh: (4) That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.*

It is important to understand that Jesus is God manifested in the flesh (1 Timothy 3:16). This flesh was NOT our sinful flesh but it was in the likeness of it. He is without spot.

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
